MOJISOLA ADEBAYO, PLAYWRIGHT

MOJISOLA ADEBAYO (BA, MA, PhD, FRSL, FHEA) is a playwright, performer, director, producer, mentor, workshop facilitator and teacher who has been making theatre for social change, internationally, for over 30 years, from Antarctica to Zimbabwe.

Mojisola's own plays include Moj of the Antarctic: An African Odyssey (Lyric Hammersmith), Muhammad Ali and Me (Ovalhouse), 48 Minutes for Palestine / Oranges and Stones (Ashtar Theatre, Ramallah), Desert Boy (Nitro / Albany Theatre), The Listeners (Pegasus Theatre), I Stand Corrected (Artscape, Cape Town), The Interrogation of Sandra Bland (Bush Theatre), Wind / Rush Generation(s) (National Theatre: Connections) and Nothello (Belgrade Theatre).

Family Tree won the Alfred Fagon Award for Best Play of 2021. Publications include Mojisola Adebayo: Plays One and Plays Two (Oberon Books), The Theatre for Development Handbook, co-written with John Martin and Manisha Mehta (Pan Arts) and Black British Queer Plays and Practitioners: An Anthology of Afriquia Theatre, co-edited with Lynette Goddard (Bloomsbury Methuen).

Mojisola teaches at Queen Mary, University of London, is an Associate Artist of Black Lives Black Words, AICRE, Pan Arts, the Building the Anti-Racist Classroom collective and an Honorary Fellow of Rose Bruford College. At the time of writing, Mojisola is on a research fellowship at University of Potsdam, Germany and is a Writer-on-Attachment to the National Theatre (UK). Mojisola's next play, STARS (Tamasha Theatre Company / Institute of Contemporary Arts) was shortlisted for the George Devine Award 2022 and premieres at ICA London in April 2023, before a national tour. MATTHEW XIA, DIRECTOR

MATTHEW XIA, one of the busiest and most exciting directors in the UK, was appointed Artistic Director of Actors

Touring Company in November 2018. He is a former Associate Artistic Director of Royal Exchange Theatre,

Manchester; Director in Residence at Liverpool Everyman & Playhouse; and Associate Director of Theatre Royal

Stratford East.

Some of Matthew's acclaimed productions include: at the Royal Exchange, Manchester Frankenstein, Wish List (also Royal Court), and Into The Woods; for the Young Vic Blue/Orange and Sizwe Banzi is Dead; and One Night In Miami... and Shebeen at Nottingham Playhouse and The Wizat Hope Mill.

Matthew's most recent projects include Feeling Afraid as if Something is Going to Happen by Marcelo Dos Santos (Francesca Moody, Edinburgh Fringe First Winner, 2022) and Hey Duggee (Cuffe & Taylor, Kenny Wax, BBC Studios, national tour Dec 2022 – June 2023), which has been nominated for Best Family Show at the 2023 Olivier Awards.

Other work of note includes: Blood Knotat The Orange Tree, Sleeping Beauty at Stratford East, Scrappers and Migration Music at the Liverpool Everyman and Playhouse; Dublin Carol at the Sherman Theatre Cardiff; and NitroBeat's Suckerpunch Boomsuite at the Barbican.

Under the pseudonym Excalibah, Matthewwas the first DJ to join BBC 1Xtra, where he spent 6 years. As a sound designer and composer, credits include: The People Are Singing (Royal Exchange); Freerun (Udderbelly; That's The Way To Do It (TimeWontWait); Bolero Remixed (New London Orchestra). In 2012 Excalibah performed as a headline DJ at the London Paralympic Opening Ceremony.

Matthewis a founding member of Act for Change, a trustee of Artistic Directors of the Future, Cardboard Citizens and Get Into Theatre, and has served on the boards of Rich Mix, Creative Futures and Theatre Royal Stratford East. He has been a judge for the Bruntwood Prize for Playwriting (2017), the Yale Drama Series (2018), the Alfred Fagon Award (2017 – 2021) and the Eurovision Song Contest (2022).

Wabriya trained as an actor at The Oxford School of Drama (graduating 2012), and brings her rich experience of the theatre world into her therapeutic and facilitation work in a sensitive and meaningful way. Alongside her dramatherapy training, she is a certified practitioner of Integrated Embodied Pyschotherapy, a methodology that combines a range of somatic, creative and neuroscientific tools to support clients to feel safe, at home and fully alive in their bodies. Wabriya also draws on her musical, movement and clowning training to offer a diverse and integrative therapeutic experience.

Alongside her private practice, Wabriya specialises as an associate dramatherapist on theatre and film productions, supporting actors and crew to manage their wellbeing and process what arises for them individually and as a team when their work addresses challenging themes. She is the resident Associate Dramatherapist at the Bush Theatre and has also recently partnered with The Globe, Theatre Royal Stratford East, Paines Plough, Hampstead Theatre and Soho Theatre to support productions including Romeo & Juliet, Typical, The Death of a Black Man and Black Love. Wabriya has facilitated therapeutic processing programmes for The Oxford School of Drama and Theatre Centre, and has experience working as a dramatherapist in NHS forensic mental health, and women's refuge settings.


TOM LIGHTBODY, LIGHTING ASSOCIATE
