Tambo and Bones are stuck in a minstrel show.

One of the most talked-about cultural events of 2023, Tambo & Bones is an exhilarating, darkly comic and provocative satire on capitalism and Black performance, that explores the commodification of the Black experience through the mediums of minstrelsy, hip-hop and afrofuturism. Spanning 500 years, Tambo and Bones journey from comedy double-act, to hip-hop superstars to activists in a future America, contending with the alarming repercussions of a nation torn apart by race. Harris' blistering play laughs through our past, blows the roof off our present and imagines an explosive future for our world and for theatre.

Daniel Ward is a versatile actor and writer. Recent theatre credits include: Cat on A Hot Tin Roof (Royal Exchange Theatre, Manchester); Rebellion and War Of The Roses (RSC); Nora: A Doll's House (Citizen's Theatre); The Amen Corner (National Theatre). Recent screen credits include: Mood (BBC); This Is Going To Hurt (BBC), A Bird Flew In and Everything Now (Netflix).

Daniel's debut play, The Canary And The Crow, which he both wrote and starred in, opened to a critically acclaimed run at the 2019 Edinburgh Fringe Festival before embarking on a UK tour and winning the 2020 George Devine Award. His theatre writing has gone from strength to strength, with Everything I Own, Ribena and Tactile Nature enjoying critically-acclaimed runs at Hull Truck Theatre, Theatre Royal Stratford East and Theatre Centre respectively.

X-BOT 1 JARON LAMMENS

Jaron is a dancer, choreographer & movement director based in London. Taking inspiration from old school hiphop and rnb, Jaron tries to blend soul and grooves to create smooth movement.

In Tambo & Bones he applies all the popping & robotic knowledge he's gathered over the years, having trained in places like Belgium, Los Angels, Paris & London.

Jaron started acting four years ago, featuring in several commercials and is now slowly discovering the taste of stage and film, which he also blends into his choreographies.

X-BOT 2 DRU CRIPPS

Dru Cripps is a British Comedy Guide award winning clown that trained in physical theatre at East 15 Drama School. Most recently Cripps has finished his Westend Clown debut for Sophie's Surprise 29th, whilst performing his sold out solo fringe shows. Cripps has been featured on the BBC, ITV, and Dave.

WRITER DAVE HARRIS

Dave Harris is a poet and playwright from West Philly. Selected plays include TAMBO & BONES (LA Drama Critics Award "Best New Play", TimeOut London "Best Plays of 2023,"), EXCEPTION TO THE RULE (Roundabout Theatre Company, 2022), and EVERYBODY BLACK (Humana Festival 2019). His first feature film, Summertime, premiered at the 2020 Sundance Film Festival and was released in 2021. Dave has written feature and television projects for AMC (Interview With A Vampire), Netflix, Apple (Widow's Bay), Amazon (The Fortress of Solitude), and FX amongst others. His first full-length collection of poetry, Patricide, was published by Button Poetry.

DIRECTOR MATTHEW XIA

Matthew Xia is the multi-award-winning Artistic Director of ATC (Actors Touring Company). He was previously Associate Artistic Director at the Royal Exchange Theatre, Manchester; Director-in-Residence at The Liverpool Everyman & Playhouse; and Associate Director at Stratford East.

Matthew has directed some of the UK's most talented actors, including Daniel Kaluuya, Cynthia Erivo, Joseph Quinn, Maxine Peake, David Haig, Samuel Barnett, Matt Henry, Karl Collins, Martina Laird, Malachi Kirby, and Erin Doherty.

Directing includes: Skeleton Crew (Donmar Warehouse); The Architect (GDIF/ATC/Stephen Lawrence Day Foundation); the Olivier Award-winning Hey Duggee – The Live Theatre Show (Kenny Wax Family Entertainment/Cuffe & Taylor); the Fringe First Award-winning Feeling Afraid as if Something Terrible is Going to Happen (Francesca Moody Productions); The Wiz (Ameena Hamid Productions/Hope Mill); Family Tree (GDIF/ATC/Belgrade/Brixton House); One Night In Miami... (Nottingham Playhouse/Bristol Old Vic/HOME); Into The Woods, Frankenstein (Royal Exchange); Wish List (Royal Exchange/Royal Court); Sizwe Banzi is Dead (Young Vic/Eclipse).

In 2001 Matthew became the first DJ to join BBC Radio 1Xtra. As DJ Excalibah he played most major festivals in the UK and held residencies at some of the most prestigious clubs including Ministry of Sound, Fabric and venues across Europe and the UK. In 2019, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate from the University of the Arts London for his efforts to make theatre universally accessible.
