You will be a champion of ATC's vision, connecting global stories with local communities and amplifying and celebrating global artists.

This is a 12-month fixed term role, with a salary of £30,000.

ATC is a portable portal to the world. Through our work, we connect global voices to local communities. Founded in 1980, we are the UK's leading theatre producer of international plays, producing a contemporary programme that amplifies and celebrates global artists from both within and beyond the UK. We are the only Arts Council England National Portfolio Organisation (NPO) with this dedicated mission. We have produced plays from the Middle East, Southeast Asia, Eastern, Northern and Central Europe, Australia and North America – bringing global stories to audiences across the UK. Our international touring includes taking our productions to Turkey, Finland, Spain and USA. Our recent work includes:

- Taking our award-winning production of *Tambo & Bones* on an 11-week mid-scale tour to 6 venues across the UK
- The Transformation Season, a season of work recognised for its innovation, excellence and impact on audiences
- Working alongside community groups and sanctuary seekers as artistic collaborators to devise *Bodies of Water*, a professional theatre piece for the 2024 Greenwich & Docklands International Festival, which gained national recognition
- Winning the 2023 UK Theatre Award for Design, for Tambo & Bones
- Being nominated for The Stage Awards 2024 including Innovation Award and Producer of the Year Award
- Named in Top Ten Theatre shows 2023 in Time Out and The Guardian
- Named in The Stage 100 2024
- Nominations for Black British Theatre Awards, The Offies, UK Theatre Awards

Overview of the Role

The Associate Director supports ATC Artistic Director Matthew Xia in the sourcing, development and realisation of new projects. This is an exciting opportunity to play an important role at ATC, contributing to our work and our mission. This role is well-suited to a mid-career director – possibly with touring experience - who aspires to lead an arts organisation. The Associate Director will support the development, making and touring of ATC's projects and be responsible for productions when they are out on tour. They will be instrumental in ATC's engagement with our audiences and communities across the UK.

The Associate Director is a vital member of ATC's team working closely with our Artistic Director to research and generate ideas for the future and deliver projects and engagement opportunities.

This is a 12-month full-time role specifically designed to allow greater opportunities to those who have encountered barriers to employment in relation to protected characteristics. Working with the Executive and Producing team, the Associate Director will have the opportunity to gain a broader understanding of a leading touring company, gaining key experience in marketing and communications, fundraising and development, governance and stakeholder relationships, as well as leadership mentoring from our Leadership team. There will be an opportunity for the Associate Director to develop and direct their own R&D during this engagement.

Artistic Duties & Responsibilities

- Support the Artistic Director of ATC in rehearsal and on tour, contributing to the whole project through planning, rehearsal, production week and tour
- Take responsibility as Associate Director for ATC productions out on tour
- Represent the Artistic Director's vision for our productions when on tour and deputise in his absence, ensuring that, during the move to a new venue, the creative vision is executed to the highest standards
- Lead on the ATC Readers Group, which meets at least twice a year to identify, source and suggest new writers and plays for ATC
- Support the Artistic Director of ATC by reading scripts, writing reports, attending readings, meetings and performances on behalf of ATC
- Proactively implement and champion the <u>Anti-racism Touring Rider</u>.
- Support or lead on development of artistic projects, through R&D, readings, workshops, and dramaturgical work with a writer or translator
- Support the administration of the production, including working within agreed budgets
- Attend production meetings, auditions, rehearsals, technical rehearsals and preview performances of the Production up to and including the Press Night Performance
- Check and note the Production whilst on tour.

- Collaborate with the ATC team in managing the hosting of international guests, including travel, networking introductions, etc., to ensure a supportive welcome
- Write and prepare Research Packs for the acting company and creative team to be used across rehearsals on specific shows

Engagement & Audience Development

- Work with the Artistic Director to develop, manage and deliver programmes of work with emerging artists and community groups
- Lead on the creation of a programme of community engagement activity to run alongside ATC's projects and productions across the UK.
- Create sustainable partnerships with audience engagement and development teams in ATC's tour venues, enabling them to become more effective in their audience development delivery and development of more ambitious audience goals.
- Lead on and manage bespoke research into audiences for ATC productions, i.e. Q&As,
 Community Events, wrap around engagement, and Black Out Nights.
- Support the publicising of the production
- Schedule Access Performances and coordinate delivery from appropriate practitioners
- Keep up to date with the work taking place outside of London, in particular potential coproducing theatres and touring companies.
- Organise, attend and facilitate pre- and post-show question and answer sessions and outreach events in the absence of the Director.

Other Duties

- Be an ambassador for the organisation and our work in the wider theatre sector
- Work collaboratively with respect, kindness and compassion as part of an engaged and supportive team.

- You have proven experience of being an Assistant / Associate Director, supporting directors to create projects.
- You have experience remounting a show across different venues

- · Experience of working with a broad and diverse range of artists and communities
- Ability to develop, produce and manage artistic projects with minimal support

- You are interested in the work of a touring theatre company and are willing to travel as part
 of your work with us
- You have experience of script-reading and making script reports
- You have experience of running participation activity such as workshops, or making theatre
 in an educational and/or community context

- You can demonstrate good administrative / IT skills
- You'll be confident in working independently, especially on tour, where you'll be working to a tight schedule to ensure the production is presented at its best in each new space.
- You're able to balance your own decision-making with a collaborative approach. An

 support you in your decisions.
- You'll be an enthusiastic and pro-active advocate for the <u>Anti-Racism Touring Rider</u>.
- You have a good working knowledge of access requests and requirements with regards to theatre, for audiences, participants and workforce.
